Indian Cinema A Business Perspective lectures were conducted by Dr. Amit Oak. that covered the overview of business of entertainment and media in India growing rapidly over the last few decades. During the sessions tremendous career opportunities in the fields of cinema and media industry that covered film, TV, press, radio, music, etc. It also provided information and insights into the working of these sectors before exploring career opportunities there. The course focused on creative and technical skills required for being an effective film and TV professional, management and business skills required to work in the real world of film and TV and Basic concepts in Humanities, social sciences and arts to develop a broad perspective for the film and TV professional, The course imparted a learning environment that supports over all personal growth.

Life Enrichment Course for MMS Batch 2023 - 2025

Life enrichment courses were offered to support learners' physical, social, emotional, and cognitive well-being in addition to the academic and general education courses. The life enrichment courses will foster learners' personal growth and creativity as these courses are essential for their overall quality of life. Performing arts, Film appreciation, ,Mindfulness, Local History and Culture were the courses given to choose.

The film appreciation lectures on March 4th and 5th provided insights into the history of film-making and cinema, focusing on visual design, sound design, cinematography, and mise-en-scene. Speakers Ganesh Matkari explained the structure of films, such as linear and non-linear, and the uniqueness of films like "Run Lora Run." Sound director Mandar Kamlapurkar discussed the importance of sound effects in film making, including sync sound, dubbing sound, boom mic, collar mic, dialogue, fogey, ambience, sound VFX, music, and silence. The "Badlapur" discussion highlighted the psychological effects of revenge and the transformative power of it. The lecture also touched on the dangers of letting emotions cloud judgment and drive individuals to act inhumanely. Santosh Pathare discussed the importance of understanding and appreciating various aspects of cinema, highlighting the concept of catharsis and the film "Glas" that transcends mere glass manufacturing. Kaushal Inamdar, an Indian music composer and musician, conducted an enlightening session on the rich tapestry of music and the intricacies of creativity. He elucidated the origins of the harmonium, its French roots, and its adoption by Indians, underscoring India's connection to storytelling and music.

The sessions were conducted by Ms. Shilpa Sane and Ms. Radhika Phanse. The performing arts session featured interactive games such as "Water Freeze," "Knee Tap," and "Chinese Whisper," promoting teamwork, communication, and creative expression. The instructor also discussed the importance of body language and first impressions. The second day focused on presentation skills, focusing on eye contact and how it impacts the atmosphere and people around them. The session concluded with relaxation and a song. The third day explored Bollywood dance, dubbing, and the vibrant world of salsa and classical dance forms. The sessions also explored the connection between dance and studies, emphasizing the importance of focus and continuous practice. The fifth day focused on concentration and attention, with games. The second half of the session focused on voice, projection, speech, and body language, teaching students how to present themselves and grab attention during interviews or presentations.

LOCAL HISTORY AND CULTURE

Local History and Culture course, conducted by Nayana Tadvalkar (Art Historian, Textile Designer and Museologist), to provide students with a deeper understanding of Mumbai's history and heritage. Over the course of 7 days, students engaged in various activities and visits to historical sites. During initial session an overview of Mumbai's formation and history was provided to students. Then, students were divided into groups and researched about the assigned historical places in Mumbai. Students prepared presentations based on their research findings. As a part of their course students visited Botanical Garden and Museum to understand the rich heritage of city of Mumbai. As a part of the course students presented, the information that they gathered through the visits to various historical locations in Mumbai. Also, as a part of the course students took signature heritage walk in association with Khaki Tours "Castle to Gateway" that covers 500 years of history in a distance of 2 km over 2.5 hrs. that covers lesser-known facts of various places like Mumbai's Oldest Cathedral, Flora Fountain, Parsi Fire Temple, High Court to name few.
